Why did you choose the plan? (Please comment on likes and dislikes of plans)

1. "I like the idea of the storage areas being positioned in the setback to allow more turning radius. Also a direct line of travel for vehicular traffic is a good idea."
2. "Seems to make the best use of the space."
3. "Visually (from Westside) schemes 2 & 3 are more interesting. Functionally scheme 3 seems to work well."
4. "The Kiwanis school is not presented. Therefore, none of the conceptual site plan is preferable."
5. "It seems the most feasible way to meet community needs. We continue to be concerned about the continuation of preschool services."
6. "All plans take away the Kiwanis hut (Options)."
7. "The Kiwanis house is not included."

What would you like to see incorporated in the conceptual site plans?

1. “A Police sub-substation (office space).”
2. “Consideration of recycling on-site debris. Recycling plan to utilize debris (esp. concrete).”
3. “A way to incorporate the school.”
4. “In the plan if it goes thru can incorporate the following #1. If you have to split the Options building to move to a different site choose a site that is still in the area that the parents and children can access / in the area of San Gabriel that they are still utilize a small spot on the current property to have shared storage or Kiwanis Community storage. So that the grills & other materials that Kiwanis store there can be secure. Look at the blue Options buildings at McKinley & Coolidge School.”
5. “We would like to see the existing preschool incorporated in plans.”

Comments

1. “If existing Kiwanis building can be moved to north-end of Westside of wash, day care might be preserved.”
2. “Much better is a land swap with Huy Fong Food.”
3. “Keep the site – even the Rubio Wash side with entry on Grand Ave. for Kiwanis and children and families. Beautify the Rubio Wash side into a nice, safe play area. Fence off the wash.”
